

- Protection of Legal Interests: The reform emphasizes the protection of legal interests through the principle of social harm, ensuring that only actions that harm or endanger these interests are penalized.
- Legal Entities as Active Subjects: The reform recognizes legal entities as active subjects in criminal proceedings, addressing their role in criminal activities.
- Rights of Victims, Offenders, and Third Parties: The reform strengthens the rights of victims, offenders, and third parties, ensuring their active participation in criminal proceedings.
- Organized Crime and Procedural Guarantees: Special investigative techniques are introduced to combat organized crime while maintaining procedural guarantees.
- Gender Perspective: A transversal gender perspective is integrated into criminal law, addressing gender-specific issues in justice.
- Expansionism vs. Minimalism: The reform balances between expanding and minimizing criminal law in response to conventional and non-conventional criminal trends.
- Prison Privatization: The reform examines the implications of prison privatization in the era of globalization.
- Alternatives to Criminal Law: Necessary and useful social reaction mechanisms are explored as alternatives to traditional criminal law, particularly in the Cuban context.
- Economic Crime: The reform addresses economic crimes in both the state and private sectors, analyzing their characteristics and negative impact on Cuba's new economic model.
- Juvenile Justice: Innovations in juvenile justice are implemented in accordance with new substantive and procedural regulations.
- Legal Assistance for Minors: The reform highlights the need to improve the legal assistance system for children and adolescents in conflict with criminal law.
- Media-Driven Crime: The reform addresses the undesirable effects of media and social networks on public security, particularly in cases of media-driven crime.
